Apple Health

Apple Health offers free or low cost health care to Washington State residents. You and your family may be eligible for free or low-cost medical, dental, vision, and behavioral health services through Apple Health. https://www.hca.wa.gov

Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC)

WIC provides healthy food to qualifying pregnant women, new and breastfeeding moms, and children under 5.

Washington State Utility Assistance Program

The Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) provides energy assistance to households in Washington through a network of community action agencies and local partners. These local organizations will help determine your eligibility and how much assistance you might receive. If you qualify, your local LIHEAP agency will send a payment directly to your energy utility on behalf of your household.
